




Ongoing Censorship of Palestinian Content

Digital violations against Palestinians have continued, mainly perpetrated by social media companies. During May, 7amleh documented a total of 304 violations, including 36 cases of account suspension and restriction, 266 instances involving violent and harmful content and behavior in the digital space, and two cases in the digital economic platforms.





Among the various forms of censorship targeting Palestinian content, the most frequently imposed measures were account suspensions and content removal.

The sanctions imposed on Palestinian accounts were distributed across various social media platforms. However, the most common action was account suspension, with 19 documented cases. This was followed by 5 cases of account restriction, 4 cases of content removal, and 2 cases of account warnings. Other types of violations amounted to 6 cases.





Among the forms of digitally harmful content and practices, most are in the form of hate speech and incitement

Among the 266 pieces of violent content recorded by 7amleh, 129 were inciting content, followed by 118 instances of hate speech. There were also 10 cases of gender-based violence, and 9 combined cases of account hacking and blackmail.





Meta Still Leads in Censorship and Harmful Content Across Platforms

During June, 7amleh – The Arab Center for the Advancement of Social Media – documented the distribution of digital rights violations and harmful content across various social media platforms. Meta, through its three main platforms, topped the list with a total of 132 violations out of the overall number recorded. This included 53 violations on Facebook, 78 on Instagram, and 1 on WhatsApp.

In comparison, 131 violations were documented on X (formerly Twitter), 16 on TikTok, 20 on Telegram, and 5 violations across other social media platforms.

The Majority of Violations Targeted Personal Accounts


Monitoring results from June show that personal accounts were the most affected by digital violations. A total of 29 cases of account bans or content removals targeted individual users, compared to 6 violations against public pages, and 1 case involving a channel. As for harmful content, including hate speech and digital violence, 254 harmful posts originated from personal accounts, while 10 pieces were shared through public pages, and 2 others came from different channels.





Digital Rights Violations in Jerusalem

Out of the total documented violations of Palestinian digital rights, 11 incidents were recorded in Jerusalem during June.
